Stewardship & Finance.....

Greetings from the Stewardship & Finance Team,

We want to take this opportunity to give you an update on the first four months of 2010. For the General Fund, from which all the expenses (payroll, utilities, maintenance, office supplies, etc.) are paid, you have given \$141,204 and paid out \$140,900. This means that we are a little ahead of our expected budget deficit. THANK YOU!

Your "extra mile" giving outside of the general fund includes \$3100 for Presbyterian Disaster Relief (Haiti and Chile), \$2100 proceeds from the Spaghetti Dinner for Presbytery de Cristo general mission, \$980 for One Great Hour of Sharing, and almost \$1100 for our own PW Celebration of the Gifts of Women. These extra gifts are so important to the mission of the Presbyterian Church in our community and throughout the world. Your continuing financial support of the mission of CPC is amazing and wonderful.

We do want to give a gentle reminder that the lean summer months are fast approaching with increases from our favorite utility (Tucson Electric - which keeps our meeting and worship spaces cool), and we need your continuing support throughout the summer. Please, if you can, continue with your estimates of giving. If you have a question regarding your estimate of giving please call the office and leave a message for me.

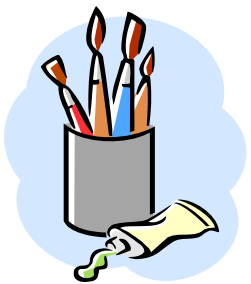
CPC MINISTRY NEWS....

Request #1

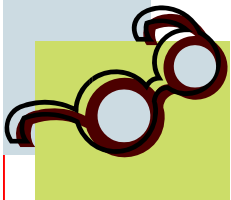

Eyeglass Recycling: Changing Lives, One Pair at a Time

Greetings from your Facility Manager,

The Building and Grounds Committee has been very busy this Spring. Our most recent project has been the installation of the Desert Garden located on the south side of Pastor Melde's office. The project was proposed in 2009 but stalled due to lack of church funding.

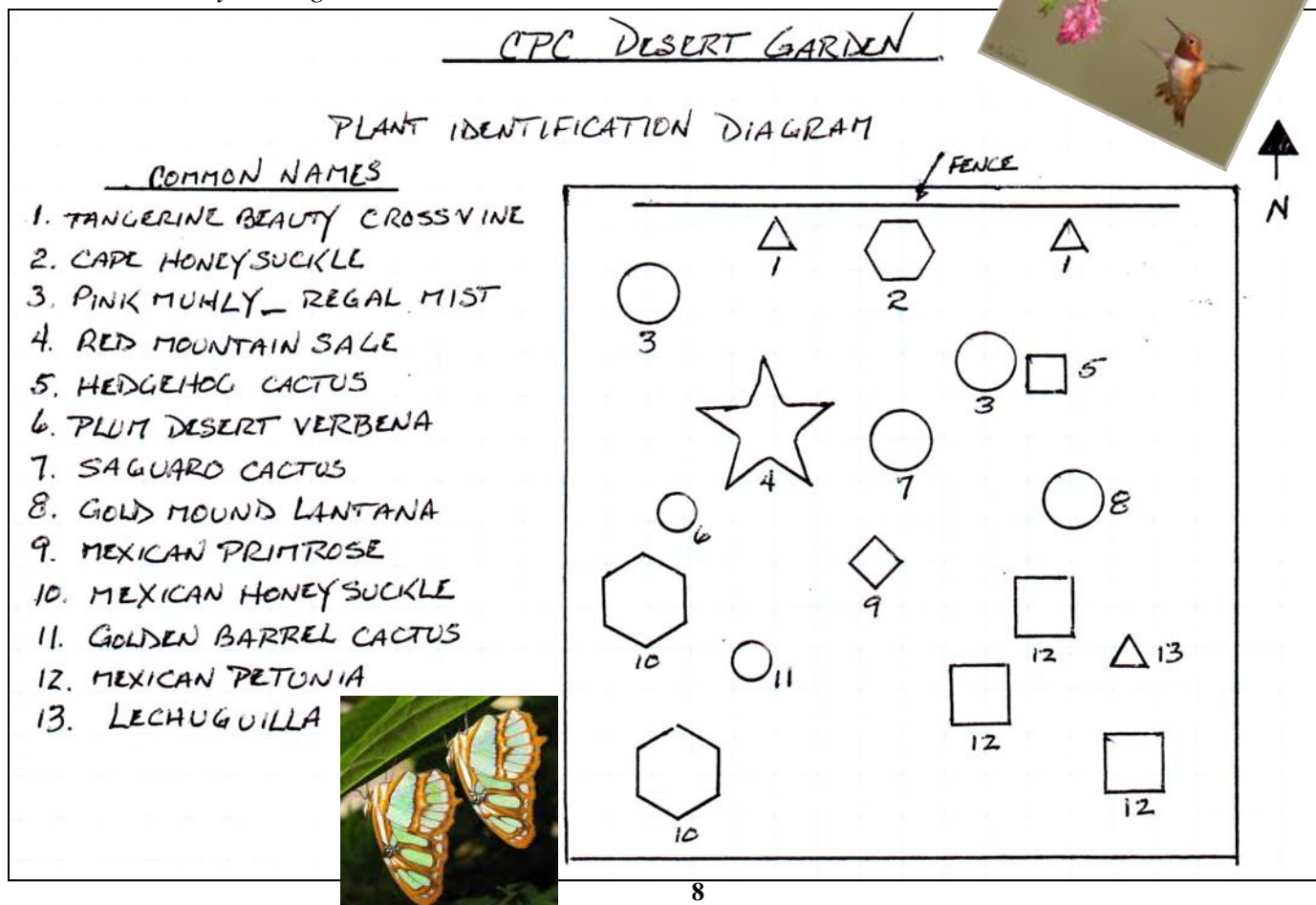
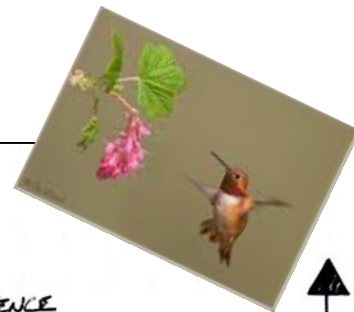
The committee felt passionate about this project and decided to proceed by securing donations of materials and labor. Jack and Joyce Dimond donated a Saguaro and Golden Barrel cactus. These were transplanted to the church by Norm Mason, Pete Cella, Bob DeRees, Steve McIntire, Dean Thorburn and me. Thank you Norm Mason for the jackhammer and trailer used to secure the plants.

Pete Cella provided a Hedge Hog cactus, fabricated the wrought iron fence and installed both the irrigation and outdoor lighting systems donated by Norm Mason. Bob DeRees painted the A/C units and has provided labor on all aspects of the project including the planting of plants and running irrigation lines to them. I provided the Xeriscape (low water) landscape design and plant selection. My intent was to provide a visual plethora of shapes and colors, while providing for various flower blooms throughout the year. The hummingbirds and butterflies will love it!

Please join me in thanking Lou Potter and Sandra Lindeman, B&G chairs, and the spear head of the project and the previously named volunteers mentioned throughout this article for their donations which have resulted in their gift to the church.

Christ Presbyterian Church is blessed with a wonderful campus. Yet the infrastructure is aging and we have had a need to add new technology to our programs as we entered the 21st century. All this has occurred during challenging/poor economic conditions.

Thankfully we are blessed with members of the Building and Grounds Committee that have provided tremendous service to the church and myself. Their donation of time, labor, and money have resulted in the completion of projects that are outside of the realm of my contract and without church funding.

On April 21st Pete Cella, Bob DeRees, Steve McIntire, Dean Thorburn, Paul Edwards and I prepared the coolers on the Multi-purpose Room for summer usage. They are held together by string, bailing wire and rust.

On April 28th, Norm Mason, Bob DeRees, Dean Thorburn and I thinned and shaped the trees and larger shrubs in preparation for the new growing season. Norm Mason provided a huge dumpster for the cuttings and hired three day laborers to help. He also used his truck, trailer, and tools to shuttle the cuttings to the rear lot where the dumpster was located. This was a long, hot day of labor. We owe a BIG THANK YOU to Norm Mason for funding this project that saved the church over \$2,000.00.

This Spring Pete Cella and Bob DeRees have installed the electric screen and projector in the Fellowship Hall. The stage lighting has been adjusted and the Fellowship Hall overhead lights are now relocated outside the fuse box and outfitted with dimmer switches. This project will facilitate light control for performances in the Hall.

Nancy Hummel is currently working with me in the Rose Garden. Her efforts help to ensure beautiful blooms for your enjoyment each Sunday.

I ask all to recognize the work of these selfless volunteers and join me in thanking them. Their work is appreciated and enjoyed by all of us. The efforts of these volunteers have saved the church over \$10,000.00 year to date! THANK YOU!!!!

MISSION TRIP TO ROCKY POINT...

VAMOS! MISSION TRIP TO ROCKY POINT NOV 11-14!

Most of your questions were probably answered in the websites referred to in last month's Kiva. But here are a few more that have been asked:

1 What about car insurance? Mexican law requires that you have at least *liability* insurance issued by a Mexican insurance company. *Collision/comprehensive* insurance is another matter. The availability of Mexican car insurance on the internet has driven down prices. If you are a Costco member, the cheapest by far is through their associate Bonita West Mexico Insurance Services, Inc. at www.bonitawest.com or 1-800-265-1365. If not a Costco member, you can go to Amor Ministries' associate www.bajabound.com. Some US insurance companies will cover you for *collision/comprehensive* within a certain distance of the border, even though your policy may not say this. Check with your agent if they cover you up to 60 miles from the border (Rocky Point). If not, or in doubt, for peace of mind, get Mexican collision/comprehensive insurance as well. And don't forget your car registration!

2. What if I don't have any camping gear? You can rent sleeping bags and tents at Summit Hut. But for the same or less money you can buy *new* bags and tents very reasonably at the big box stores. Caution: air mattresses and thick sponge rubber pads will not fit side by side in 2-person backpack tents, so get 3 or 4-person tents with floors for each twosome, or larger ones for families. CPC has a limited number of air mattresses from Project Hospitality for loan to church members for this mission. Tip: If you bring an electric blanket, a long extension cord, and ear plugs you'll sleep fine.

3. Do I need to buy pesos? No. Dollars are gladly accepted everywhere. But since your meals and camping space is pre-paid you will not need a lot of cash.

4. If I am a minor traveling with another family or friends, what additional documents will I need? If traveling with another family, you will need a notarized parental consent form signed by both parents. If traveling with only one parent, you'll need a notarized consent form by the other parent. You will be given more specific information at the orientation meetings. And don't forget your birth certificate!

5 What about the water? Even though the local water is okay, your stomach may not agree, so drink bottled water. But you can wash and brush your teeth in the local stuff.

6. Where do I go for a passport or the new passport card? Once you have your DS-11 form filled out (but not signed), your certified (embossed raised seal) original birth certificate, picture ID and two passport photos, several US Post Offices will accept them and your check or money order. Hours are 9:30 to 2:30 Monday thru Friday. You must appear in person, and all minors 16 and older must have one parent with them. The nearest are the Coronado Station on Rosemont, or the Midtown Station on 5th Street. Tip: Cheaper passport photos are at Walgreens or Costco, not at the post office.

7. What if I want to participate but am not able to work with hand tools around a building site? Two alternatives are to join the kitchen crew in meal prep, or help with Pantano Christian's street ministry project for local children living around the building sites---more about this at the orientation meetings.

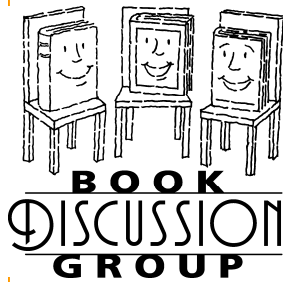


Office Volunteer Appreciation Luncheon June 17th 12:30 here at CPC in the Fellowship Hall.

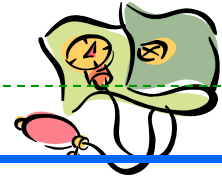
Helpful Info.....

SAFeway

Every year we must do the annual renewal of our Safeway cards for credit to continue to CPC youth. If you were previously listed with us we have renewed for you. 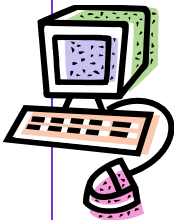
Health Sunday

The parish nurses are available on Blood Pressure Sundays, usually the fourth Sunday of the month, to collect expired prescription and over-the-counter medications. These medications will be donated to World Care. This is a great opportunity to clean out the medicine chest and help others who may not be able to afford medications. World Care sends the medications to developing countries. This is also a very safe way to dispose of medications that are no longer needed.

Medications should never be put down the drain, because sanitary systems are unable to filter the medications out of the water. Empty medication bottles may be placed in the blue Parish Nurse Bin near the windows on the west side of the Fellowship Hall.

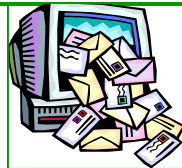

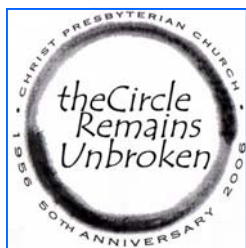
