A Word or two from Pastor Melde..

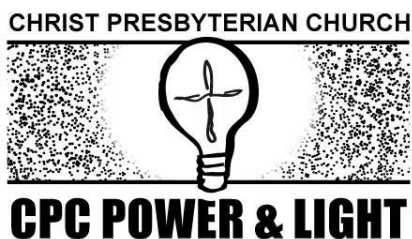

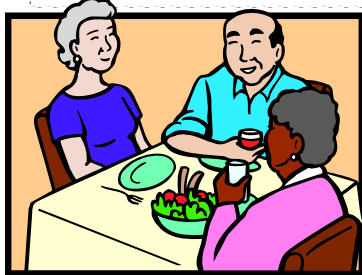

"Thank You" CPC Volunteers..

Dear Congregation;

At a recent meeting I was asked, "Is it a good idea for you to publicly name and thank the B & G volunteers that work and in some cases, finance, Building and Grounds projects?" I admit I was momentarily taken aback.

I have had over 35 years of supervisory and management experience in both the public and private sectors. Additionally I have experience operating in several volunteer organizations. My Masters in Management and additional hours of management training extolled the virtues of employee and volunteer recognition. Unless I had violated someone's request for anonymity I was at a loss to see how volunteer praise and recognition was a negative.

Therefore my response to the question was that I want to publicly thank and commend volunteers for their selflessness and simultaneously it is my hope that others may be encouraged to contribute their talents and resources to the church. I truly value the volunteers that work with me in Building and Grounds and I want them to know it! It is also important that you, the congregation, know what they do to improve your church home while saving our church budget thousands of dollars that would normally be paid out to sub-contractors and vendors.

The question did provoke further thought on volunteerism at CPC. Suffice it to say that there are various motivators that influence people to volunteer. If you were to volunteer with the idea of being recognized publicly, you may be disappointed. But understand this, the most compelling reason to volunteer at CPC is because you are NEEDED!

The church can only operate with the assistance of volunteers. Consider the following work that is accomplished with volunteers: choir, soloists, musical groups, audio-visual operators, food preparation and kitchen cleanup staff, food and supply purchasing, ushers, tellers, communion servers, greeters, Sunday school teachers, Deacons, Elders, Session, Committee members/chairs, attendance clerk, Sanctuary pew care, and a host of other positions and functions. As you can see, the church cannot function without volunteers, without you. The quality of the volunteer directly effects the quality of the organization.

In summary, I will continue to praise the volunteers that affect my area of concern in B&G. That is my work ethic and part of my job description. However, it is the responsibility of all of us to acknowledge and thank the various volunteers that make CPC our church home. Thank you for your "Thank You's"

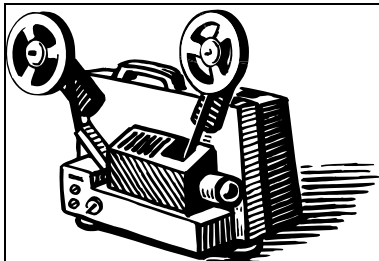

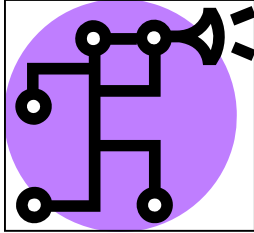


Prayer Shawl Ministry - Every First Tuesday at 1p.m

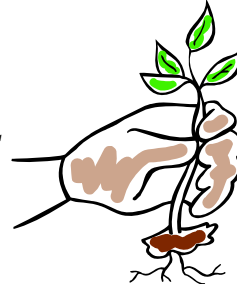

Casa Maria Sandwiches...



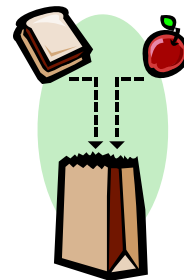
CPC is Making a Difference
with Casa Maria Sandwiches

On the 4th Tuesday of each month CPC prepares 200 sandwiches for the Casa Maria Soup Kitchen. We rely on the members of our congregation to make the sandwiches and drop them off prior to the time we put them together. They can be made any time, labeled Casa Maria and put in the freezer in Fellowship Hall. Anyone

can make sandwiches for this program. If you wish to make sandwiches for this program, here are the guidelines:

1. Take a loaf of any kind of bread (you can do more than 1 loaf if you wish). We recommend the sandwich loaves because you can get more sandwiches out of them.
2. Make sandwiches: You may use any kind of cold cut but we have found that bologna with a slice of cheese works best. You may also make peanut butter and jelly but this can be a little dry if the homeless person has nothing to drink. You can put either some mustard or a thin layer of butter on the sandwiches. NO mayonnaise or anything else like ketchup as the homeless carry these sandwiches around with them and these items will spoil. Please, no pickles as they make the bread soggy.
3. Put each sandwich into a sandwich bag.
4. Put all the sandwiches back into the plastic sleeve that the bread came in. (We have found that this is the best way of transporting them, but you can put them into anything you like.
5. Mark the bag Casa Maria and bring to the **freezer** in Fellowship Hall.

On the 4th Tuesday of every month at 9 AM volunteers place 2 sandwiches, a piece of fruit and a couple of cookies into individual bags which are then brought to Casa Maria. If we don't have 200 sandwiches, these volunteers must make sandwiches so that we have 200 to deliver. The Deacons also buy the fruit and cookies that go into the bags. If you don't wish to make sandwiches but want to contribute, we can always use cookies (store bought is fine with us). If you wish to donate cookies, just mark them for Casa Maria and put them in the **freezer** in Fellowship Hall. If you would like to help out on the 4th Tuesday of the month, contact the church office, 886-5535.

Helpful Information About CPC

SAFEWAY

Every year we must do the annual renewal of our Safeway cards for credit to continue to go to CPC youth. If you were previously listed with us we have renewed for you. If you have recently obtained a Safeway card we need to add your card number to our account. Either fill out the form on the counter in the office or call the church office.

ALBERTSONS

The Community Partners cards are in! You can pick one up in the church office. Then, every time you shop at Albertsons have the clerk swipe the card. CPC gets 1% of the first \$50,000 of purchases and \$5 on everything over that per quarter.

Health Sunday

The parish nurses are available on Blood Pressure Sundays, usually the fourth Sunday of the month, to collect expired prescription and over-the-counter medications. These medications will be donated to World Care. This is a great opportunity to clean out the medicine chest and help others who may not be able to afford medications. World Care sends the medications to developing countries. This is also a very safe way to dispose of medications that are no longer needed.

Medications should never be put down the drain, because sanitary systems are unable to filter the medications out of the water. Empty medication bottles may be placed in the blue Parish Nurse Bin near the window on the west side of the Fellowship Hall.
